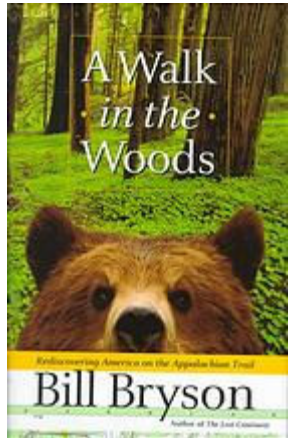

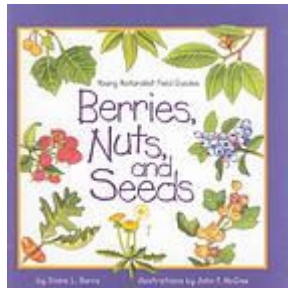

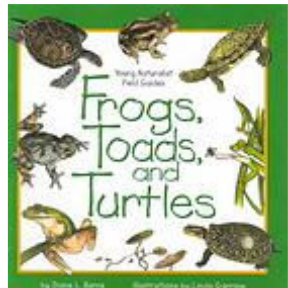
Bryson, Bill. *A Walk in the Woods: Rediscovering America on the Appalachian Trail*. New York: Broadway Books, 1998. Print.

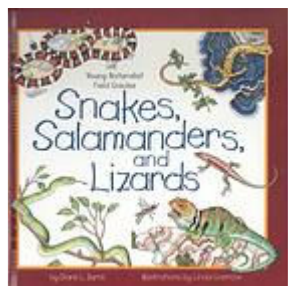

Describes the physical characteristics, habitat, and diet of thirty kinds of frogs, toads, and turtles.



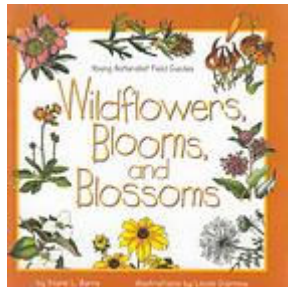

A field guide introducing thirty species of snakes, salamanders, and lizards. Includes blank pages for drawings and notes.



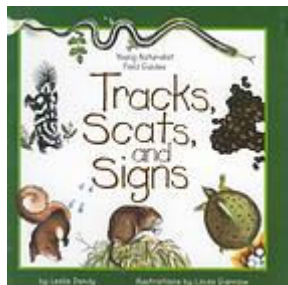

A guide to sixteen trees found in the United States, providing information about their lifespans and uses, leaves, bark, and seeds.



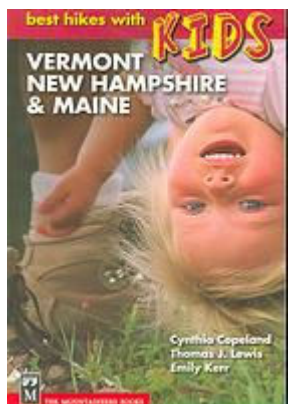
