Describes the partnership between Dolores Huerta and César Chávez, the founding of the National Farm Workers Association, and their combined efforts to improve working conditions for agricultural laborers. Presented in English and Spanish.

Introduces the life of Nellie Bly who, as a "stunt reporter" for the New York World newspaper in the late 1800s, championed women's rights and traveled around the world faster than anyone ever had.

Young Carlitos helps his mother on the picket lines when she decides to go on strike for a better wage to feed her family. Based on the 2000 janitors' strike in Los Angeles, and presented in side-by-side English and Spanish.

Color illustrations fill this chronicle of legendary pacifistic social activist Mohandas Gandhi, whose work to change India's caste system and free India from British rule inspired both Martin Luther King Jr. and Nelson Mandela.
