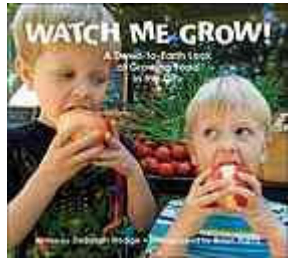

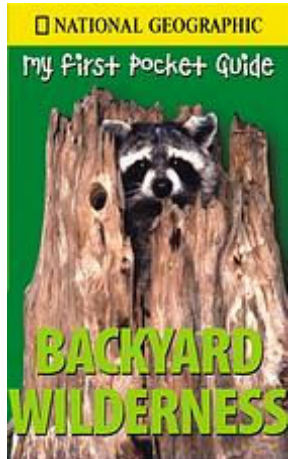

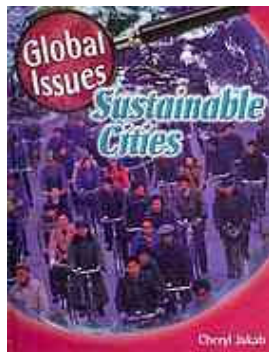

Examines gardens in the city and other places to grow food, herbs and to raise animals.



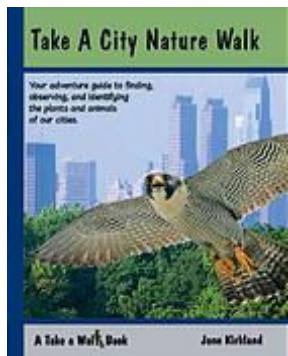

Describes a variety of animals and insects that can be found close to home and offers tips on how to observe them.







